NORONT, HATCH AND ALGOMA STEEL SIGN RING OF FIRE PACT

"Noront is partnering with two Ontario-based industrial and engineering giants to advance Ring of Fire development," said Alan Coutts, President and CEO of Noront Resources. "This is truly a 'made in Ontario' collaboration on one of the most economically and socially important projects our province has seen." The agreement with Algoma provides Noront with a five-year, renewable option to lease a brownfield property in Sault Ste. Marie for a period of 99 years. Noront plans to design, construct and operate a ferrochrome production facility which will service the company's Ring of Fire chromite deposits. NORONT SECURES SITES FOR FERROCHROME PLANT TO SERVICE RING OF FIRE DEPOSITS

TSX-V-listed Noront Resources has secured a property in Sault Ste Marie, Ontario, to build and operate a ferrochrome production facility to service its chromite deposits in the emerging metals camp known as the Ring of Fire. The company this month entered into a five-year option agreement to enter into a 99-year lease for a parcel of land next to primary steel producer Algoma Steel's mill.
