MUSK PROMISES 'GIANT CONTRACT' FOR EFFICIENTLY MINED NICKEL

Elon Musk has a plea for mining companies: "Please mine more nickel." "Tesla will give you a giant contract for a long period of time if you mine nickel efficiently and in an environmentally sensitive way," said Musk, chief executive officer of the electric-carmaker, during a second-quarter earnings call. Musk's plea comes as one of Japan's general trading giants is about to take a roughly \$500 million write down on a nickel project in Madagascar because of low prices and the coronavirus pandemic.

FORT ALBANY TROUBLED BY RAPIDLY APPROVED CHANGES TO EA PROCESS

Fort Albany Chief Leo Metatawabin says he is troubled by the "rapid and potentially illegal passage" of a bill which he says makes remote Northern communities vulnerable by weakening the environmental assessment process. "These changes are part of an ongoing effort by this government to overhaul Ontario's environmental protection regime in support of its promise to 'cut red tape' in support of economic interests," said Metatawabin, in a release issued by the First Nation. "Too often this has seemed to mean weakening protections for vulnerable species and ecosystems based on the false idea that we can have a healthy economy without a healthy environment.

On July 8, 2020, the Ford government in Ontario introduced Bill 197 -- the COVID-19 Economic Recovery Act, 2020, and a mere 13 days later the Bill became law. The changes put Ontario's fragile environment, and First Nations who depend on it, at serious risk.

ONTARIO MUST ACT TO PREVENT HIDDEN DEFORESTATION, ENVIRONMENTAL GROUP SAYS

Thousands of hectares of boreal forest in northwestern Ontario have been laid to waste by the forest industry but remains unaccounted for under Ontario's forest management and climate change plans, according to a new report from the Wildlands League. The environmental group released an online catalogue on Thursday of nearly 300 sites that have remained barren for up to 30 years. The total deforested area amounts to about 650,000 hectares or roughly 1.5 times the size of Lake Nipigon, according to Trevor Hesselink, director of policy and research for the Wildlands League. The sites, which Hesselink calls logging scars, are left on the landscape by access roads and heavy equipment use. Those areas fall outside of Ontario's forest management planning regime.

INJUNCTIONS AS A TOOL OF COLONIALISM

The trends in injunction decisions highlight key issues in the unsettled relationship between Canadian law, Indigenous rights and resource development. First, the courts' tendency to refuse injunctions based on the balance of convenience has the potential to undermine Indigenous peoples' confidence in the overall utility of Canadian law. It is worth considering why, in measuring the balance of convenience, economic interests are so frequently found to outweigh the protection of Indigenous peoples' title and rights.

K'ATL'ODEECHE FIRST NATION GETS OUT FROM UNDER THE INDIAN ACT'S THUMB

K'atl'odeeche First Nation (KFN) has spoken loud and clear – they want more authority and responsibility over their land. On July 29, members of the roughly 700 person reserve near Hay River, Northwest Territories passed a custom land code allowing them to manage their own land, resources and economic development in a timely manner without federal oversight from Indigenous Services Canada (ISC).Just over 30 per cent of the 500 eligible voters cast their ballot. Out of the 153 who voted, 144 were in favour of the new land law.

ARDIDEN HITS PICKLE LAKE EXPLORATION SNAG

Ardiden said the Ministry of Energy, Northern Development and Mines issued a July 31 letter to all exploration companies that permit applications were placed on hold under the state of emergency declared in Ontario in mid-March.

The company is seeking a renewal of an exploration permit from three years ago. The one for Kasagimminis was due last March, precisely when the province imposed lockdown measures that impacted government processing of permit renewals. As well, the net of consultation with area First Nations must be cast wider.

NORONT EXPLORATION AND EAGLE'S NEST PERMITTING UPDATE

Noront Resources Ltd. is reopening Esker Site and mobilizing its team to resume exploration activities in the Ring of Fire. "We are initiating a late summer field program that will require 12-15 people during which we'll employ soil sampling to explore for gold and airborne geophysical surveys to explore for nickel," said Noront President and CEO Alan Coutts. Esker Site was closed in early April to protect staff and the communities surrounding Noront's operations from the spread of COVID-19. Now that the site is reopening, a rigorous back-to-work protocol is in place. It will ensure workers travelling to and from the site are symptom-free and low risk. In addition, travel will be reduced to essential staff with minimal planned flights. While at site, workers will practice social distancing and wear face masks when necessary. Regular sanitizing of common touch points will be performed daily. At no point will Noront flights will be landing in either Webequie or Marten Falls First Nation as per guidance from the local Chiefs and Councils.

NORONT RESUMING EXPLORATION IN RING OF FIRE

Noront previously discovered anomalous gold mineralization in over 50 diamond-drill holes along a fault zone and in the so-called Thunderbird intrusion, located 13 kilometres northeast of Esker Site. "Both occurrences are close to the Webequie Shear Zone, which is believed to be prospective for greenstone-hosted gold mineralization but has never been explored for gold," Noront said. Soil samples will be collected in an area measuring 10 by 5 kms along this zone "to detect areas of anomalous gold indicative of a bedrock source."
